

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time - 2016: PRAYER

The Our Father prayer that Jesus taught his disciples is the perfect prayer that always challenges us, as it answers our deepest questions. Like all good prayer it is not just spoken words, an incantation that performs magic. Heartfelt prayer is more a state-of-being than repeating words committed to memory or read off a page. What is our hope when we pray? We might persist in our prayer in the hopes of changing God's mind, but our true hope is that our heart will be changed. We may pray for our "ship to come in," but the best possible outcome is when everyone is best served, and that is the coming of God's Kingdom. Today's Gospel from Luke (Chapter 11: 1-13) includes the Lord's Prayer and some very specific advice on prayer. We would all do well to reflect on His advice.

First of all Jesus encourages his followers to be persistent in their prayer. I believe that this persistence is intended to help better conform our will to God's will. The words, "Your will be done" (Matthew 6: 10) is clearly the approach that Jesus took in his own prayers. Recall His prayer before his arrest, "Father, if you are willing, take this cup away from me; still, not my will but yours be done." (Luke 22: 42) At this point Jesus trusts his Father. He steps into the abyss of his passion and death trusting that his death will be a falling into the loving arms of his Father – and his Father will raise him up. This kind of trust on our part requires the change of heart that I spoke of earlier. This change of heart is the desire and prayer for our will to be conformed to God's will, and not the other way around. This is in spite of the challenges and hardships it may present to us. Remember it is we who need to change, not God.

Jesus also instructs his disciples to "ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." (Luke 11: 9) You might ask, "what should I ask for if it is God's will I wish to conform myself to?" I believe you could ask for many things, but asking for wisdom would be a good starting place. Scripture tells us that if we pray for wisdom, wisdom will be granted to us. (I Kings 3: 9-12) Wisdom is not the riches that the world recommends, but true wisdom is worth more than gold. (Proverbs 16: 16) With wisdom what will I be able to accomplish – will my needs truly be met?

This brings us to Jesus' third lesson; a good parent provides what his child needs most. Everything we have is from the Lord. Beginning with our life on earth, the world and all it holds for us, the people in our life, everything is from God. We should not doubt for a second that God always provides what we need to live good and fruitful lives. Notice I did not say God grants all our wants. We often wish for many things that might not be needed or even good for us to have. I find that when I am pleading God for what I want, it is often in the form of a bargain. "Dear God, please let me win the lottery. I promise I will do so much good with the winnings." This kind of bargaining is not real prayer, but rather dickering with God for what we want

A good way to stay on track in our prayer is to always end as Jesus ended his prayer quoted above, "but not my will but your will be done?" What is chiefly needed in prayer is trust in God – trusting that God knows what is best for us and if we ask with this in mind we will have the peace that is the hallmark of a healthy prayer life. Also know that life is full of challenges and these too come from God. St. Paul wrote, "...we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit which has been given to us." (Romans 5:3-5)

Speaking of challenges, I would be remiss if I neglected to mention one of the most challenging parts of the Lord's Prayer. "...forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us,..." I often wonder if I really mean this part of the prayer. I wonder because of my slowness to forgive others who have offended me. Do I want God to delay in his forgiveness of my offenses? If I don't want God's mercy delayed then I too must be quick to forgive others. To this end I pray today for God's grace to allow me a merciful heart. I will end the reflection on prayer, with the prayer we pray at the beginning of Mass during this Jubilee Year of Mercy.



Monthly Council Meeting Highlights

Meeting Opened 7:30 pm

Spiritual Reflection - Deacon Paul discussed how we should not neglect our Catholic hospitality. Deacon Paul read Luke's gospel involving Martha and Mary, where it provides that hospitality has two dimension; Caring for your guests and Attention to your guests. That the main aspect of hospitality is not to be too busy but be attentive to your guests. Caring for others means you are caring for the body of Christ. As Knights we do this very well.

Reading/Approval of Minutes - Minutes from last meeting were approved.

Report of Admissions Committee and reading of applications - Eric Evans is our Chairman of our membership committee for this year. We had a 1st degree exemplification July 19th at Council 3121. Four candidates were read in and approved. These four candidates were: Siaffa Kroma, Charles Rawlins, Ben Warne and Jose Rojas.

Grand Knights Report – GK discussed how a meeting was held with all directors and Chairman to determine what activities they are in charge of and how best to move this council forward. The list of directors and chairmen will be posted on the web site. GK also provided an update from Helen's Hope chest: Our Council donated 100 backpacks in support of foster families. They were extremely grateful for this donation.

Report of Service Programs:

Father Son Campout - Alex, so far we have 36 people who have signed up. \$670 was deposited with financial secretary. Need to get applications in since the shirts need to be ordered in a week. Still owe the camp \$600.

Community Director Report - Frank, updated the council on the karate class held Saturday's in buildings H & I at 9:00am. We have four knights in the class.

Knights Program Chairman Report - GK, updated the council two programs:

- 1.) **Knights Kids:** have been postponed due to ongoing negotiations.
- 2.) **Keep Christ in Christmas campaign:** GK created and presented a spreadsheet showing various magnets, ornaments and pins that can be ordered and showed a cost to buy, sell and the expected profits. There is no competition to the gift shop. Plan is to start selling product the Sunday before Thanksgiving through Dec 18th. Motion was made and approved to set aside up to \$700 to purchase ornaments soon to get free shipping and the officers would decide which items would be ordered from the sheet.

Call to Protect Chairman Report - Mike, was not present but GK discussed that all Knights need to go through the call to protect program and diocese requires this be updated every year. There are dates at Saint Andrew the Apostle for CTP: Tuesday July 26th from 6-9pm, Monday August 22nd from 6-9pm and Saturday Sept. 10th from 9:00-12:00 in the adult ED center. You can also renew online.

Unfinished Business - Back packs for kids is doing great. School supplies are starting to come in as well.

New Business - Frank Saavedra recognized Mike Threadgill for an outstanding job of volunteering. There is no Job that Mike has not volunteered for this past year. Frank Saavedra recognized Tom Moore for outstanding job for what he does for this council and is voted our council knight of the year. GK gave Frank Saavedra his medal for service as grand knight last year. GK mentioned Father Robert with fellow priests and nuns want to go to a conference in Washington D.C August 3rd – August 7th. Father is asking for assistance in buying an airline ticket for one of the Nuns. A motion was made and approved that council will set aside \$500 for the ticket and Alex Santucci was going to look into using miles to assist with this ticket as well. Donations also welcomed. Remember also to get your food handlers card updated for the up-coming pancake season.



Update Your Beneficiaries

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take, for example, the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it may very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since married, your policies should be updated to reflect your spouse as beneficiary. Maybe you've had children since, who are not named on the policies.

Most people list a primary beneficiary, who is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – that is, the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.

I look forward to meeting with each of you to discuss your family's needs.
