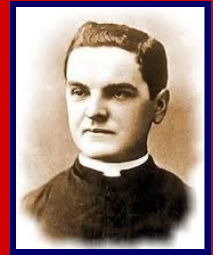

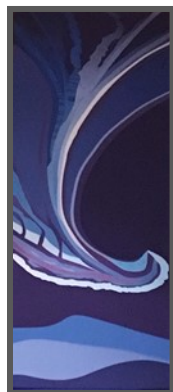
Lecturer Message

Advent Message

Before Mass on the eve of Thanksgiving a friend of mine asked me what the meaning of the art on the new altar cloth and banners was. At first I could not give a good answer because I had forgotten what father John had said last year. Then I was reminded that it was the artist's interpretation of the creation of the universe. This begged the question, 'well, why the beginning of the universe as the theme of art for Advent?' Advent is a time of waiting, waiting for the birth of Jesus, and waiting for the return of Christ. Like Advent – the beginning of a new Liturgical year - Both of these are beginnings as well. The beginning of God's Kingdom on earth with the birth of Jesus 2000 years ago, and the beginning of a new Heaven and a new Earth in the second coming of Christ at the end of time.



In John's Gospel we read...

*In the beginning was the Word,
and the Word was with God,
and the Word was God.
He was in the beginning with God.
All things came to be through him,
and without him nothing came to be.^b
What came to be through him was life,
and this life was the light of the human race;
the light shines in the darkness,
and the darkness has not overcome it. (John 1:1-5)*



The beginning of the liturgical year is a good time to be reminded of the first beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, and a good time to reflect on the second coming. This reminds us that we have a God who is ever renewing his love through the renewal of his covenant of creation. 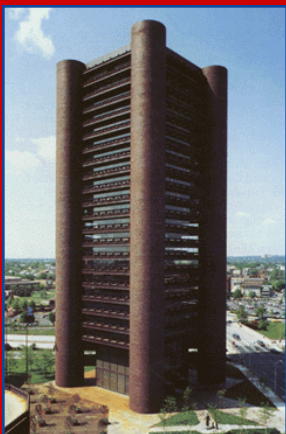

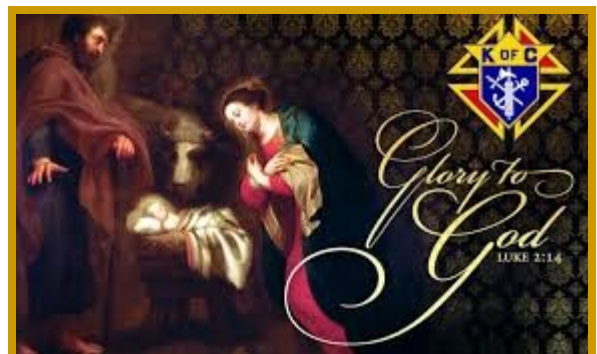

Brother Knights,

Here is a brief report of the trip that Gerry Smith and I made to the O.L.P.H. Orphanage in Jeremie, Haiti back in October (19th - 23rd). We had four objectives: (1) to deliver 180 +/- pairs of shoes for the kids in 7 suitcases; (2) to obtain complete measurements for the electrical system up-grade for the boys dormitory being sponsored by our Knights of Columbus Council; (3) do research for upgrading the water storage system at the boys dorm being sponsored by one of St. Andrew's parishioners; and (4) to deliver a letter from Father Scott to Father Garry to reinforce our parishes support of the orphanage and to collect some important records for the transition to our new Pastor Fr. Robert.

We arrived in Port Au Prince on Monday and we made a trip to a local supply house MSC+ (Home Depot of Haiti) to see what materials and equipment could be obtained locally for our proposed electrical up-grade project. The good news is that any and all materials could be purchased locally. An analysis will have to be done to determine if it is cheaper to ship donated electrical supplies from Phoenix to Haiti or source them in PAP. The next day we traveled to the Orphanage.

Upon arrival in Jeremie, Father Garry, Mme. Diline and Victor, our translator, greeted us. Everyone was most anxious to hear news about Father John, they told us how everyone was praying for him and looking forward to when he could come back to Jeremie. We spent the afternoon at the boy's dorm doing our investigations for our future projects. With the help of some of the boys I measured and drew up the dimensions of the boulangerie, (bakery) and the boys dorm so that our electrical designer would have an accurate floor plan to assist in creating his design. Father Garry had previously requested a second 300 gallon +/- backup storage tank for water so that they would have enough water when their water supply was interrupted. He also showed us where an unused 5000 +/- gallon cistern was located that he would like to start using as a backup water storage source. The water system has many leaks and broken lines and is in poor repair.

It was great seeing the boys and they all asked about Father John. The girls walked the almost 1 1/2 miles from their dorm to see us as well. They likewise asked about Father John and were anxious for him to get well and return to see them.

Wednesday morning we met with Father Garry, Diline and Patrick, to go over Father Scott's letter and gather the necessary information for a smooth transition.

Wednesday afternoon was spent at the boy's dorm finalizing measurements, playing ball with the kids and passing out shoes. The kids were thrilled with their shoes and truly appreciative for everything that St. Andrew's does for them. We had an early Thursday afternoon flight back to PAP.

The Monday after our return, Rachael and I hosted a dinner meeting with Fr. Scott so that Gerry and I could debrief Father Scott on our trip and turn over all the Information provided by Fr. Garry and his staff.

I rate the trip a great success in that we accomplished all four goals listed above. There has been a lot of anxiety amongst our friends and kids in Jeremie over Father John's health, Father Rick's death and our cancelled early October trip. Everyone wants Father John back in Jeremie whenever he is ready to travel and his welcome will be huge.

Deacon Paul's Advent Message Continued:

Perhaps this year will be for us a source of grace energy and the time to bring about the coming of God's kingdom here on earth. Advent is a time for the waiting of the arrival of Jesus. However, keep in mind that it is more than just waiting for the first coming – the coming of the baby Jesus... More than that, Advent is about waiting for the second coming of Christ that is written about in our Gospel today. And more than a past coming of the Baby and the future coming of Christ the King, it is also about the present Kingdom of God. A kingdom that is already, but not yet... The Kingdom that Jesus preached about is that Kingdom that already is within us, but needs to be brought forth in our lives. You might ask, "What does this have to do with me?" The answer to this question is the point Paul is trying to make with the Christian community in Thessalonica. He affirms their conduct, but exhorts them to work even harder to bring about the community of love and justice (Kingdom of God) by living this love through their actions in their dealings with each other.

The challenge is how to keep this spirit alive in the hustle and bustle of our daily lives – especially this time of year when there are so many demands on our already busy lives. ...so many expectations to fill the space under the Christmas tree. There are also the distractions and demands on our time; with the social calendar being filled with holiday parties, and year-end work goals fast approaching. This very thing is that warning in Luke's gospel is addressing...

"Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life, and that day catch you by surprise like a trap." (Luke 21:34)

There is much said in Church circles about "keeping Christ in Christmas", let us then pray like St. Paul...

Lord make us increase and abound in love for one another and for all..., so as to strengthen our hearts, to be blameless in holiness before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his holy ones. [Amen.] (cf. 1 Thessalonians 3:12-13)

Isn't this the true meaning of Christmas that we await? If Jesus is the prince of peace and the revelation of God's love on earth, then we should be like him so that we can see him. Then maybe this Advent can be a time of peace and joy as God intends.
