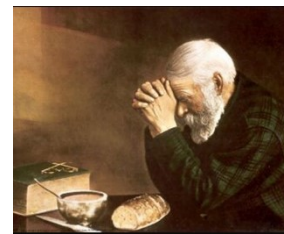

Good day gentlemen. Saturday morning I drove over to the building site that we are going to be building with Habitat on January 20th. I met with Mike Swanson and Ed Flynn from St Andrew's Habitat ministry and with the Habitat House Leader, Wayne. I confirmed our commitment to providing 20 workers and providing a good lunch for all the on-site workers (probably cooking for 40 people in total). It looks as if we'll be framing the second floor, framing interior walls, and wrapping the second floor exterior with OSB sheeting. I was asked by Mike Swanson (SATA) if our KC Council could invite some of our state and district leaders to the build, even if only for lunch, so as to promote more KC involvement from other councils/assemblies and from our district and the State. The Tempe build site is easy to find.

The House Leader, Wayne was very excited to have the men from the Knights of Columbus coming that day and he was very excited that the KC's were providing lunch for everyone, stating, "The KC's know how to really put on a feed for workers". As of this writing, I have 14 Knights committed, and hopefully we'll get the rest of the volunteers at our regular council/assembly meetings on January 15th.

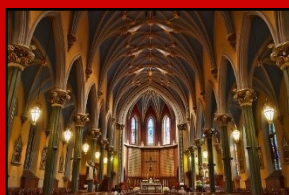

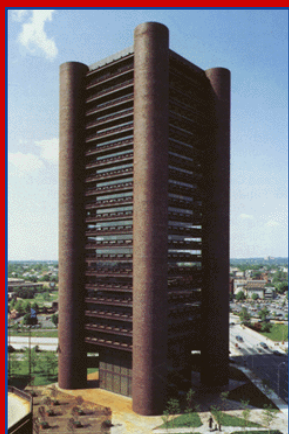

Plan for this Tax Day and into the Future

April 15 (tax day) is right around the corner. 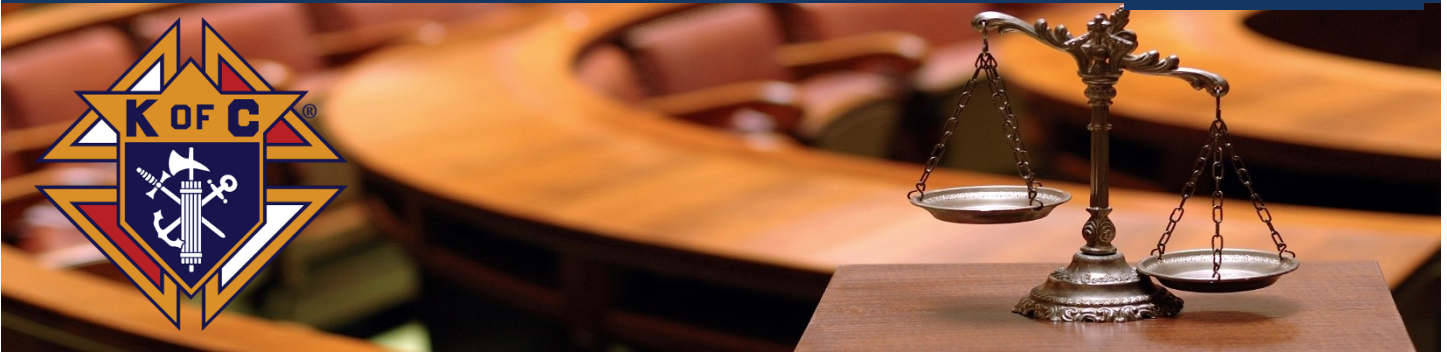

What do you do in Probate ?

I am often asked what needs to be done during the Probate process? I usually begin that it all starts out with who is doing the work, this is the Personal Representative or also referred to as the Executor of an Estate. To be the Personal Representative an individual must have been either named in a Will, or appointed by the Court. Now this is not some fancy title, but it's a serious position in which you have a fiduciary relationship to properly administer the Estate. This means that if you do the job incorrectly, or do anything illegal, you can be held personally liable. For example, Lets pretend you pay off a creditor, only to find out that they were supposed to be paid last not first and now there is not enough money to pay everyone else. Guess what, you are now personally liable to pay the other creditors yourself. This is why I always recommend that if you are ever named in a Will to be a Personal Representative, to always seek legal help with an Attorney you trust.

To help illustrate the Probate Process, here is a 50,000 feet look down at what needs to be done:

- 1.) **Initiate Probate and Prove the Validity of the Will:** The Personal Representative initiates the Probate process by filing a petition with the Probate Court. If there is a Will the Court must validate the Will, if there is no Will then the Court must appoint the person the Personal Representative.
- 2.) **Obtains Letters of Administration:** Once appointed the Court will provide "Letters of Administration", which I like to call the Magic Papers. This allows the Personal Representative to take over the Estate, including taking Title of Real Property, Bank Accounts, etc.
- 3.) **Post Bond:** A Personal Representative must be bonded unless the beneficiaries, or the Will specifically waive this requirement.
- 4.) **Give Notice:** The Personal Representative must give Notice to everyone, the beneficiaries, creditors, pretty much the world.
- 5.) **Take Possession of the Estate Assets:** The Personal Representative must take control of the Estate's Assets in order to determine how it is going to be distributed to the beneficiaries, or used to pay creditors, etc.
- 6.) **Create an Inventory:** The Personal Representative must inventory the entire estate down to the penny. Within 90 days from appointment the Personal Representative must give a preliminary inventory to the beneficiaries for a review, if not they can be held liable for breaking their fiduciary duty.
7. **Pay Taxes:** The Personal Representative must maintain the value of the Estate during the Probate process. The Personal Representative must facilitate the payment of both the personal tax return for the decedent "IRS 1040" and the Estate Tax Return ("IRS 1041").
- 8.) **Distribute the Estate Property:** Per the terms of the Will or the Arizona Probate Code for Intestate, the Personal Representative must pay the Taxes, Creditors, and then whatever is remainder will go to the beneficiaries. The distribution can either be in cash, or in kind.



As you can see there is quite a lot to do when you are a Personal Representative, and it is very easy to make an error. If you ever have questions or need help regarding the Probate process, please let me know I am here to help.

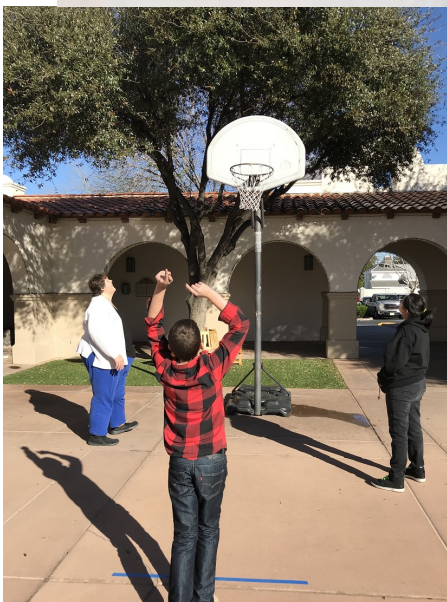

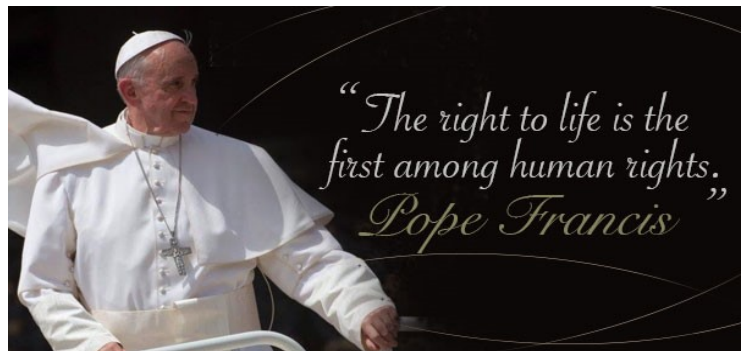
