



#### Assembly #3591 Year End Report

From our humble beginnings with just over 40 Sir Knights making the choice to form our "St Andrew the Apostle Assembly #3591" at the end of last year, we have successfully grown the Assembly to the 64 members it has today. I believe this is a direct result of many dedicated catholic men stepping "Into the Breach" as Bishop Olmsted proclaimed in his Apostolic Exhortation just before the formation of our new Assembly. We through our actions, activities and spiritual

lives & prayers provide a very visible arm for Knights in our Council and all other men to follow. I'd like to reflect on this past year programs and activities.

- As I said above we started with 40 members and in less than one year had a 60% increase in our membership! (Lets keep this up and recruit our active 3rd Degree brothers to join our Patriotic Degree)
- Our Color Corp. (those with Regalia) has also grown from 19 original members to 24 (Plan on helping us grow this number as well)
- Successfully started our Chalice Program and had the honor of presenting the first chalice in memory of Sir Knight Fr. Rick McGuire, presented to his Order who then offered it back to St. Andrews so it would be used in the celebration of mass within our parish.
- In June, we had an outstanding and record breaking number of 18 candidates take their 4th Degree and complete their journey to full knighthood.
- Our Color Guard (who were well trained by our new Color Crop Commander, Dan Blomberg) actively participated in many call outs here at St Andrews as well as several within our district and state level.
- Several members (under the guidance of Sir Knight Deacon Paul) began and continue to work actively with the Justa Center for the elderly homeless and especially the veterans who served our country and now need our assistance.
- We have hosted a couple social dinners (and plan to hold more this coming year
  thanks to the efforts of Sir Knight Ron Delperdang and his team) the members and
  their wives really enjoy these relaxing evenings and offer us all the opportunity to get
  to know each everyone on a more personal level.
- With the help of Sir Knight Stephen Sparks we offered voter registration information to the parishioner's after all the masses, to assure that everyone had the opportunity to vote.
- The members fully supported a patriotic project that was suggested by one of our new Sir Knights, AJ Fifer. It was to install American Flags in each of the classrooms at St. Andrews. This was done over a couple weekends and we have received so many positive comments on us taking this initiative
