



Nativity of the Lord - 2017 Incarnation

One of my earliest Christmas remembrances is of my mother trying to find something for each of us children to receive on Christmas. Like it was yesterday, I remember my mother sitting in the hall chair by the phone with the Sears & Roebuck's catalog in her lap and the six of us clamoring around her making our requests known in the most urgent of terms. I can only imagine how hard it was for her trying to make our Christmas wishes a reality on what was a very limited budget.

At that time, my father was a traveling salesman and was gone much of the time. This left most of our Christmas preparations to mother along with all the normal responsibilities of a mother. In the midst of all this, my mother was able to pass on the real meaning of Christmas to us, the birth of the Christ Child. At the time we children only vaguely understood the fullness of the meaning of the Virgin birth, but it was our mother who planted this seed of faith. More concretely, my mother passed on the faith by how she lived her life. Since then, time, grace, and deeper reflection on this mystery have grown this belief into the full gravity of what is meant by incarnation, the birth of the child we celebrate each year.



Incarnation is the meaning of the season. In God's infinite wisdom, God chose to create all that is, and in God's complete humility, God chose to enter creation and become one of us. In this choice by God, and with the cooperation of Mary, the union of divinity with humanity was accomplished in Jesus Christ; Son of God – son of man. "For the Son of God became man so that we might become God." (St. Athanasius) "The only-begotten Son of God, wanting to make us sharers in his divinity, assumed our nature, so that he, made man, might make men gods." (St. Thomas Aquinas – See Catechism of the Catholic Church #460) What this means for us now and forever is nothing less than Heaven.

I say "now and forever," because the union of flesh and spirit that was begun in Bethlehem 2000 years ago continued in the bodily resurrection of Jesus, and continues today in each one of us. The union of flesh and spirit culminates in Heaven for us, but it begins in the birth of our faith here on earth. "We who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death. We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life. For if we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection." (Romans 6:3-6)

Our belief in the "bodily" resurrection of Jesus underlies our basic premise of body and spirit being joined in Christ. This union of flesh and spirit, which begins with the birth of Jesus, culminates in his resurrection. What is true for Jesus is true for us, that we will also be raised on the last day. Otherwise, if there is no resurrection of Jesus there will be no resurrection for us. This is quite traditional and orthodox here. Resurrection does not only mean an eternal reward in the future. "For behold, the kingdom of God is now." (Luke 17:21) This means living the prayer Jesus taught his disciples, "Thy kingdom come thy will be done." Choosing to live a life where, "all the way to Heaven is heaven and that way is the way of Christ." (Catherine of Siena)

Resurrection is the Incarnation taken to its full and logical conclusion. What we choose now, we will indeed be for all eternity. It is our own decision to make; do we accept the gravity of how we choose to live? Do we believe that the birth of Jesus ushered in a new way of life for the world? Are we ready to live fully in the spirit of Christmas, as the union of body and spirit? It is our choice and we make it in total freedom. We can choose to keep Christ in Christmas, but that means living fully the incarnation of body and spirit. To live this way is to give our children a gift that will never disappoint, and that they will never outgrow. This is an idea that may be too much for us now, but if we are willing the Holy Spirit can make up for whatever is lacking.



Initiations: Update on Upcoming degrees

- 1st degree admissions degree exemplification will be at St. Andrew the Apostle, December 20, 6:30 pm.

Grand Knights Report

- **1st Degree Admission Ceremony** will be held at St. Andrew on Wednesday, 12/20 at 6:30pm in Adult Ed. Notice has been sent out by SK Grand Knight John Simpson to the entire district
- **Star Council:** we are at 38% of goal so far; 8 new members toward 19 so far; 2 more making their 1st Degree this month. Moving along very well!
- **Items from the Mid-Year Meeting in Glendale:**
 - A suggestion was made at the meeting that the raffle tickets should be mailed out by the councils to all members. Sales were \$337k in 2017, a 6% increase YoY. Goal for 2018 is \$350k.
 - Ultrasound Machine drive: raise \$40k and state will match with another \$40k to purchase this machine. Each council is being asked to donate \$300 toward this program.
 - **Call-to-Protect:** Emphatic message that members get signed up and take this training!
 - Annual convention will be in Tucson in 2018; precise location, date, time TBD





“Here are some ways to help protect your assets in case you are sued”

Now a days, lawsuits can happen to anyone at anytime. In the Unites States alone, there are over 15 million civil cases filed each and every year.

For those who work in the field where lawsuits occur the most, this being doctors, lawyers, architects, pharmacists, and business owners, getting sued is inevitable. Fortunately, there are some asset protection tools that can help shield your property and possessions from these would be creditors. Here are a few ways that can help make you less attractive to someone wanting to sue.

Insurance. Having adequate insurance both for yourself and for your business is the first line of defense when it comes to protecting your assets. It is always important that you work with a professional that you trust to ensure you have sufficient coverage. You should be sure to check and update you coverage regularly. The Knights have an amazing insurance program, and Tom Moore is our agent, and the person I trust. So if you are unsure if you have enough coverage, or need help then be sure to give Tom a call.

Set Up A Business Entity. When you own everything under your own personal name, or under the name of one company, a single lawsuit can result in a catastrophic loss. Sometimes it is better to hold your most valuable assets: real estate, equipment, businesses, and even investment accounts in separate entities. For example I once had a client who inherited over 7 figures from his father who had passed away. He wanted to invest these funds with an investment broker. However, he also owned a few rental properties and wanted to make sure that his inheritance was protected. So my partner and I created a Limited Liability Company (“LLC”) holding company in which our client was the sole manager and member. Now if he were to ever be sued it would make it very difficult and expensive for the person suing him to try to obtain access to these funds. Business Entities are by far the most common form of asset protection, and the cost is relatively low in terms of the protection you can receive.

Offshore Accounts. I know this sounds silly, and this is why I saved it for last, but if you have a significant amount of money that you need to protect this is always an option. A foreign asset protection trust (FAPT) is a trust held in another county, placing some of your assets out of the reach of the courts in the United States. Lawsuits that are targeting assets held in offshore trusts are litigated in foreign jurisdictions, and are subject to foreign laws and justice systems. This aspect alone may be enough to dissuade someone from suing you. FAPT are usually very expensive and are subject to heightened scrutiny and accounting requirements so in order to do one it must be really worth it.

Attendance at our Assembly Meetings continues to grow with well over 50% of our members in attendance.

Summary

In the last 4 months, we have doubled the number of 4th degree candidates in the state over the last 2 years. Discounts on new uniforms ended Nov 30, and an extension of this is not imminent. Per Vice Supreme Master Mike Kingman, there are 8000 backorders; order placed in Sept are just now being shipped. The District Master welcomed a new Bishop (7th) to the PHX area—Edward J. Weisenburger. The pin with Flag and 4th degree emblem is now no longer official new pin with 4th degree emblem is now current the revised pins are on order. The date for transitioning to new regalia has been moved back to June 30, 2019. Brian Sayer handed out small plastic soldiers (blessed by a priest) and asked fellow Knights to carry these as a call for remembrance that 8.2 million US soldiers have not returned from the battlefield, counting all wars since the Revolutionary War.

The Fourth Degree currently is involved in a couple of projects which include:

C.C.C. Call-outs

We had callouts at St Andrew for our 5th Sunday Rosary Mass. We participated in a Rosary and Funeral for Deacon Richard Kubrick at Resurrection parish and the arrival of USS Arizona flag at American legion Post 39 in Gilbert, 8 or 9 additional Knights were also at this touching remembrance of the lives lost that day. As part of the ceremony, the flag was paid tribute to all points of the compass and a 21gun salute was fired - Jonathan Goodrich attended. Upcoming callouts will be for the Christmas midnight mass and the New Year's Eve: Rosary at 5 pm mass.

More than 50 new coats were distributed at the Justa Center recently; they were accepted with great appreciation. Forty more coats were provided in December. Altogether more than 100 coats were donated to the Justa Center this year—not counting the Coats for Kids. 


Unfinished Business


