Lecturer Message By Deacon Paul Hursh



Our Sunday's gospel contains one of my favorites and most often used prayer, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me."

Beyond learning this line as a quote from the Gospel of Mark, I came to a deeper understanding of it as a prayer in the anonymous 19th Century Russian work, <u>The Way of a Pilgrim</u>. In this autobiographical story we hear the life story of a simple man who lost everything, and had nothing but the clothes on his back, the Bible in his knapsack, and the bread he had begged for that day. This man was struck one Sunday at Mass by St. Paul's imperative in his First Letter to the Thessalonians (5:17) to pray without ceasing. He (and I) wondered how can one pray without ceasing?

This simple pilgrim sought out a spiritual advisor to answer this question for him and he found out ultimately that prayer is not simply words but a state of being. The words we say are simply the external vehicle that focuses our mind so our spirit can be in the undistracted presence of God. Like this simple pilgrim we too can place ourselves in this state by the simple recitation of the Jesus prayer. When I am agitated and worried about the future or saddened and disappointed about the past I resort to this prayer. Like the pilgrim we need to focus our being by repeating this prayer over an extended period of time, and in time it can become a way of breathing; saying "Jesus, son of David..." (breathing in), "...have pity on me" (breathing out). In time, I find the prayer becomes second nature and my spirit quiets. In time, I find I have a more peaceful countenance. Another time I use this prayer is when I cannot sleep because my mind has become too busy. At times it seems like my

brain is a tree full of chattering monkeys. I find that if I begin to recite this prayer it is not long be-

There is a shift in me when I enter that place of prayer. It is a place beyond the physical world, the world that is passing away. Our lives are finite and we do not have a lasting city here on earth. I realize that I am only a pilgrim and my security and stability is rooted in God. This is a truth that is not based on what I possess, rather, the Truth is the person of God. This is not to say that, as a disciple of Jesus, I do not have a responsibility to act. I have been given certain gifts and these gifts need to be used in the service of the Kingdom. But I can free these gifts and be more effective when I realize that we are ministers and not messiahs. We do all we can do and then turn the rest over to God. This week I am traveling to the orphanage in Haiti with Gerry Smith of our parish and I am more than a little anxious about what we can accomplish and the work we have before us. My intent is to make full use of the Jesus prayer. I ask you to also avail yourselves of this prayer on behalf of your work and our shared work right here in the Kingdom that is already, but not yet.

Brief Directives for Prayer of the Heart (From The Way of a Pilgrim)

- 1. Sit or stand in a dimly lit and quiet place.
- 2. Recollect yourself.

fore I am at peace and sound asleep.

- 3. With the help of your imagination find the place of the heart and stay there with attention.
- 4. Lead the mind from the head to the heart and say, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me," quietly with the lips or mentally, whichever is more convenient; say the prayer slowly and reverently.
- 5. As much as possible guard the attention of your mind and do not let any thoughts to enter in.
- 6. Be patient and peaceful.
- 7. Be moderate in food, drink, and sleep.
- 8. Learn to love silence.
- 9. Read the scriptures and the writing of the Fathers about prayer.
- 10. As much as possible avoid distracting occupations.
