Lecturer Message By Deacon Paul Hursh



26th Time of Ordinary Time—Driving Out Demons

Have you ever heard the saying, "What goes around comes around?" I am writing about how we treat anyone, is how we treat everyone – even ourselves. ...and how we treat others comes back to us. It is a point that has come out clearly with the teaching of Pope Francis. He is calling everyone to treat each other with compassion, mercy and justice. His teaching is less a pronouncement from above than a desire for a sincere dialogue where everyone is welcome. A good example of this invitation for dialogue is expressed in his address before the U.S. Congress.

As challenging as the Pope's message to the U.S. Congress is, he is basically saying one thing. "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you" (Matt. 7:12). Whether he is speaking about the life issues of capital punishment and abortion, social issues of immigration and economics or the environment; the thrust is that we need to treat others as we would like to be treated. In every case he is asking that we walk with humility, act with justice, and love with tenderness (and in this he includes all of creation).

No doubt there are challenges enough in the Pope's message for everyone. Just as we may find some of his words supportive of our personal views in some areas, it is likely that we find it hard to agree with his words in other areas. As it has been reported in the news following his Congressional address, "there was squirming on both sides of the aisle (Democrat v. Republican) depending on the subject." This does not, by any means, mean that his message was inconsistent. Consistent throughout his message was his challenge for unity. Whether it is a unifying, or consistent life ethic, or the refusal to see others as any-thing but our brothers and sisters. To divide the field between them or us; good or bad; worthy or unworthy; – is nothing other than diabolical.

Interesting to note that the word "diabolical" and "divide" come from the same root. Jesus came that we might be one. "...so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you..." (John 17:21) In this Sunday's Gospel we hear of those who cast out demons in Jesus' name. Jesus, himself, casts out demons, and in casting out demons he is reuniting those who have become possessed. This is precisely the salvation that Jesus came into the world for. With the fall of Adam, man was separated from God and thus we became separated from each other. This was the doing of the devil. The devil tempted Adam and Eve to disobey God's will and as a result they fell out of that intimate relationship that they had enjoyed with God up to that point. With Cain and Abel the division entered in and separated man from his brother.

Jesus comes to save us by healing the wound of separation. He prays to his Father that we might be one and he asks us to pray the Our Father "...thy will be done...,

Without living God's will there is the loss of hope and an ultimate separation that is epitomized by Hell. C.S. Lewis (Anglican Theologian) once wrote, "There are only two kinds of people in the end: those who say to God, 'Thy will be done,' and those to whom God says, in the end, 'Thy will be done.' All that are in Hell choose it. Without that self-choice there could be no Hell." You see, good works are their own rewards, and evil works are their own punishment.

Heaven is choosing to be with God, Hell is choosing to be alone. God's will is that we spend eternity with Him and Jesus comes to teach us by example how to begin that life right here in the now. This teaching has been the consistent message (and action) of our Pope.

Raising Awareness About Life Insurance Oct, 2015

Like most awareness-raising campaigns, Life Insurance Awareness Month was created because there is an overwhelming lack of understanding of life insurance, its uses, its benefits, and its variations among the general public. Each year, the Life Insurance Market Research Association (LIMRA) puts out the results from a recent survey, and unfortunately, the numbers they report continue to be discouraging.

A recent survey found that more than 75 percent of people polled did not have a personal financial advisor, even though 68 percent of them said their opinion of the current economic conditions was somewhat unfavorable or very unfavorable.

In other words, a majority of those surveyed were uncomfortable with the economy and the uncertainty it brings, yet they did not seek professional assistance. Maybe they spoke with their friends and family. Maybe they hoped the instability would go away on its own. Maybe they did not know to whom to turn.

If you fall into this category, please remember that as a member of the Knights of Columbus, you have a full-time, professional agent you can call your own. My primary responsibility is the care and service of your family's life insurance, retirement and long-term care needs. I'll answer your questions because I want your decisions to be informed ones. Driving Out Demons—Continued

And how does Pope Francis invite us to join Jesus in rebuilding the unity of creation epitomized by the Kingdom of God? Precisely the same way that Jesus did. We build the Kingdom by working for justice and being compassionate and loving to others. Especially for the least, and the stranger, and yes, even to those we might label enemies and sinners. This is why Pope Francis has called for a jubilee year of mercy. To bind up those who are broken and have found themselves separated from the whole. This is why he has also called for the abolition of capital punishment – precisely because God never ceases to hold out his unfathomable mercy, even to the very moment when a person steps over the threshold into eternity.

The Pope also challenged Congress (and by extension, he is challenging us) on the issue of immigration by challenging us not to divide the field between citizens and strangers. This is very advanced morality. When we can listen to Jesus' message, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid." (Matthew 14:27) we can begin to see the stranger as Jesus in disguise. (cf. Matthew 25: 31-46) If we have faith in Jesus, we can see and receive him in the person of the outsider and stranger. This requires us to set aside the basic human response of fear to what we find as alien. Francis, encouraged Congress to extend to immigrants the same compassion and love we would extend to our own children.

Finally, when we become Kingdom seeking people we become those who would restore the Garden of Eden – that place where Adam and Eve first experienced an intimate relationship with God – where we are one with God. This is the wisdom of our Pope found in his message, his invitation to dialogue on the Environment. He is calling for us to act now for restoration of the Garden. No longer are we to monetize the Earth for our own personal gain. He invites us to see creation as divine manifestation and as such to see and preserve it whole, now and in the future. If we can cast out the demon of greed and exploitation we can regain the paradise that was God's gift to us, to our children and to our Children's children.
