

April Reflection Easter

"For when peaceful stillness encompassed everything and the night in its swift course was half spent,

Your all-powerful Word from heaven's royal throne leapt into the doomed land,... (Wisdom 18:14, 15) This season we observe what to me are the two most momentous events since the creation. On March 25 we observed the solemnity of the Annunciation/Incarnation when the creator entered into his own creation.



With the Annunciation, Mary said "Yes" to God's invitation. It wasn't an "OK", or some passive agreement. The Church calls her yes her "Fiat". Merriam Webster provides this definition: ...act of will that creates something without or as if without further effort. Her Yes was an act of will, a total, complete surrender of her own will, her whole self to the will of God. With that yes, the Son of God through whom all of creation came into being, entered into his own creation. I think every atom of the universe must have shuddered.

Now Jesus became man, entered into all that it means to be human, giving up his divine prerogative but not his divinity, for one purpose – to rescue me, to rescue you, to rescue all of humanity.

For most of my life I viewed the story of the fall of Adam and Eve as - so they are an apple they weren't supposed to. God said don't but they did it anyway. Kind of like when Mom said stay out of the cookies and I are one anyway. It's not the end of the world.

Well, guess what. It was. Adam and Eve turned their back on God and all that he had for them. They said, you're holding out on us. We want it all and we want it now. This serpent said you're a liar and we believe him.

With that yes to the serpent, Adam and Eve surrendered all of creation to sin, to death and to hell. I think you could say it was a betrayal, an act of treason. They made a deal with the devil and in doing so, they sold themselves and all their offspring and all of creation into his dominion. With Mary's yes to God, the rescue mission begins.

Holy Mary who, with your fiat, your love for God and his creation burst through the gates of the dark dominion so that the one who is the Light of the world could enter in, pour out your graces on us your sons so that we may love as you do. The whole of the Paschal Mystery is about our redemption, our deliverance from the dominion of Satan. As Moses

The whole of the Paschal Mystery is about our redemption, our deliverance from the dominion of Satan. As Moses delivered the Hebrews from the dominion of Pharaoh, Jesus delivers us from the dominion of sin.

Beginning on Holy Thursday, we begin the journey through, or into, the Paschal Mystery. All of these events are made present.

The Last Supper, the Agony in the Garden, the betrayal by Judas, the trial, scourging, crowning with thorns, crucifixion and Resurrection are all re-presented, made present in every Mass, but during Easter week we have the opportunity to see it all, to feel it all, to come to a greater appreciation and understanding of what Christ did for us.

At every Mass, we are called to do more than just observe. We are called to participate, to enter into the Mystery. So, as that old wonderful by manages. "Were you there when they crucified my Lord?" was we are there

as that old, wonderful hymn asks, "Were you there when they crucified my Lord?", yes we are there.

We are there at the Last Supper as Jesus institutes the Eucharist. We are there in the garden as he is pressed down with the weight of our sin, our grief, our doubt, our suffering, our betrayal, our indifference.

We are there when Judas betrays Our Lord with a kiss. As I was reflecting on this, it came to me that the name of Jesus is like a kiss. When you say that holy name, is it a kiss of affection, of trust, of love, or is it a kiss of betrayal?

We are there for the trial, the scourging, the crowning with thorns. Are you among the crowd? Are you cheering on the Roman soldiers as they tear the flesh from Jesus' body with their cruel whips? Do you see me among the crowd? Jesus gave St. Faustina to know that the scourging was for the sins of the flesh.

We are there for the crowning with thorns. Bishop Fulton Sheen explains that this was for the sins of the mind. Our pride, envy, egotism. How often did we spit upon him with our putdowns of others designed to make us feel more important? We are there as the crowd demands he be crucified. "Crucify him!" I'll do it my way. "Crucify him!" I'll be me. "Crucify him!"

We are there as he carries his cross, as he falls, as he sees his Mother, as Simon of Cyrene is pressed into service to help carry the cross. Perhaps now we begin to understand, to appreciate what he is doing for us. Perhaps now we begin to understand that he will walk with us in our suffering, that he will help us to bear our burdens.

We are there as he is nailed to the cross, as he says, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do." He's not asking this just for those who participated in the whole cruel play of events at the time. He's asking for you, for me.

We are there as he gives us his Mother to love and cherish. Hail holy Queen, Mother of Mercy, our life, our sweetness, our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then most gracious advocate thine eyes of mercy toward us and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet virgin Mary.

We are there with Mary Magdalene when she finds the empty tomb. He is risen! Alleluia, he is risen! Death has been conquered. We are free, free at last. Alleluia!

What a gift Our Lord has given us with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Do I dare approach him through whom all that is was created, who suffered, died was buried and rose from the dead, and now wants to unite himself with me there present in the Eucharist?

Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.


